<p><b>Communication and Language</b> – To become a <b>Confident Communicator</b> Who can listen carefully in different situations, hold a conversation with friends and adults, ask relevant questions and use new vocabulary to explain ideas and feelings, with confidence.</p> 	<p><b>PSED</b> – To become an <b>Independent Individual</b> Who can follow the Golden Rules, set simple goals and persevere to achieve them, select resources, manage their own personal needs and know how to stay fit and healthy.</p> 	<p><b>PSED</b> – To become a <b>Fantastic Friend</b> Who can be kind, caring and helpful, show empathy and respect to others, work and play co-operatively whilst considering others' ideas and feelings.</p> 	<p><b>Physical Development</b> – To become a <b>Magnificent Mover</b> Who can show strength, balance and co-ordination when playing, move confidently and safely in a variety of different ways, using a range of equipment.</p> 	<p><b>Physical Development</b> – To become an <b>Equipment Expert</b> Who can hold a pencil correctly using the 'finger thumb flick' technique. Use a range of equipment e.g scissors, cutlery, paint brushes etc. safely with confidence and control.</p> 
<p><b>Reading</b> – To become a <b>Passionate Page turner</b> Who has a love of reading, use new vocabulary to talk about what they have read or has been read to them. Who enjoy and can accurately read simple sentences using the sounds that they have been taught in phonics.</p> 	<p><b>Writing</b> – To become a <b>Wonderful Writer</b> Who has a love of writing, and enjoys creating written pieces independently. To become motivated and independent writers who can write letters that are formed correctly, write words and simple sentences, using the '5 finger check'</p> 	<p><b>Maths</b> – To become a <b>Marvellous Mathematician</b> Who can confidently show a deep understanding of numbers to 10 through the use of practical equipment and words to explain their thinking. Become passionate about everyday maths, including, recognising patterns within the number system, comparing quantities, recalling number bonds and recognising basic 2D and 3D shapes.</p>
