We use Restorative Practice to resolve problems and support pupils to take responsibility for their behaviour and how it affects others.

At Chapel Allerton Primary School, we want our pupils to be happy and healthy both physically, mentally and emotionally. Our curriculum has been designed to provide pupils with the knowledge and skills to lead healthy and fulfilling lives. Our MindMate curriculum is key to ensuring that our pupils have a strong grounding in emotional literacy, which focuses on the key skills of self-awareness, self-regulation, motivation, empathy, and social skills.
